Class Description

This course is the second part of a B2 level, following from English Vantage B2.1. It will follow the objectives

outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. It aims at:

- consolidating English structures;
- increasing students' speaking fluency and accuracy, so that they can interact with a degree of spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party;
- improving students' ability to understand concrete and abstract texts, including literary ones;

- increasing students' ability to express their viewpoints on complex and frequently polarizing issues, both in speech and writing;
- improving students' writing skills, especially with regard to essay writing;
- expanding students' vocabulary;
- improving students' listening comprehension skills.

Language skills will be developed through:

- Reading: newspaper/magazine articles, short stories, a novel;
- Writing: essays, emails, creative writing pieces;
- Speaking: discussing everyday and abstract issues; an oral presentation; participation in discussions and debates; roleplaying everyday life situations;
- Listening and watching: audio files, short videos, TED talks, a documentary film;

Doing grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation exercises.

Grading and Assessment

The aims of the course will be achieved by means of a varied range of activities which will serve as the basis for continuous assessment. There will be equal attention given to the development of all four language skills: reading, listening, writing and speaking. In class, students will often work in pairs and in groups. Oral presentations will be done individually.

Assessment criteria:

Attendance + class participation - 25%

Oral presentation (TED talk style) - 25%

Test (vocabulary + grammar) - 25%

Final essay (written in class, based on a novel) - 25%
