Learning Objectives & Course Content

- Develop critical thinking skills by considering diverse perspectives on art.

2. English Expansion:

• Vocabulary Development:

• Acquire and apply key vocabulary related to diverse art forms including TV, film, theatre, visual arts, performance art, political art and/or 'artivism', circus, opening ceremonies, musicals, street art, spoken word, rock operas, mime, dance, opera, etc.

• Please note that it is highly unlikely that we will be able to look at all this stuff in such a short time.

- Use the above-mentioned vocabulary when:
- Analyzing and discussing the various art forms, either in written or spoken form.
- Comparing and contrasting different art forms to identify commonalities and differences.

• Watching performances that may include the English language (e.g. stage plays, performance art, TV shows).

• Reading reviews written by professional journalists from respected newspapers or academic institutions.

• Writing well-structured reviews/critiques expressing personal opinions and insights on performances or art collections that we will view either on the internet or that we will see on field trips – please remember when writing or presenting reviews/opinions to include persuasive writing techniques.

- Practicing/Demonstrating your English during class discussions and oral presentations.
- 3. Developing Cultural Awareness:
- Explore the cultural and societal impact of different art forms.
- Discern the role art plays in reflecting and shaping culture.
