Class Description

In this course, we will focus on various topics in contemporary analytic epistemology. Among the topics and questions that we will consider are:

- Reasons for Belief: What should we believe? Only what the evidence supports? Or can there be practical reasons for belief?
- Doxastic Voluntarism and Epistemic Responsibility: Can we belief at will? And if not, are we responsible for our beliefs?
- Belief and Morality: Does moral ignorance exculpate? Do moral beliefs make a difference to moral worth?

- Norms of Inquiry: What's the relation between inquiry and belief? What are norms of inquiry? And how do they relate to epistemic norms?
- Epistemic Virtue: What are epistemic virtues? And how do they explain epistemic normativity?

Grading and Assessment

Provisionally: One oral presentation (30%) and one paper (70%) on topics previously agreed with the instructor.
