Class Description

An analysis of St Basil's influential discourse on secular education from the viewpoint of intellectual and educational history, including the history of literary interpretation and reception and literary theory. Several parallel texts will also be examined: excerpts from e.g. Philo of Alexandria, Plutarch, pseudo-Plutarch, Clement of Alexandria, St John Chrysostom, and Leonardo Bruni.
