Class Description

The seminar focuses on the analysis of the poetry of one of the most important poets of the first half of the 20th century, T. S. Eliot. We will unfold close readings of The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock, Portrait of a Lady, Gerontion, The Waste Land, The Hollow Men, Journey of the Magi, Ash Wednesday and Four Quartets, through which we will observe how in Modernism the poem is anchored in wide and polyphonic dialogues with "the love that doesn't dare to speak its name" through decorum and narrative allusions (Dorian Gray); enunciates social criticism and deconstruction of the ethos through irony; conceives polyphonic encounters with history, literature (Shakespeare, Laforgue, Baudelaire, Dante et al) and anthropology (Weston, Frazer), through

allusion and fragment; elevates the text to a ground of metaphysical and theological meditation (Bible); is written in the encounter with and in the revision of previous poems.

Grading and Assessment

Assessment is based on three elements: oral presentation (25%), essay (50%), sessions participation (25%)
